Dear Official:

An official must fill out an application, pay the application fee, attend or view a 2009-2010 NSAA sponsored rules interpretation meeting, and score the required percentage on the open book test **EACH YEAR** for each sport in which he/she wishes to officiate in order to officiate high school varsity football, volleyball, softball, basketball, wrestling, swimming/diving, baseball, soccer, and track and field in Nebraska.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PAYING BY CREDIT CARD:

5. PRINT SCREEN FOR YOUR RECORDS AND RECEIPT
6. IF YOU REGISTER ONLINE DO NOT MAIL THE FORM

APPLICATION DATES AND DEADLINES

Officials are urged to return the NSAA official's application form and application fee as early as possible or register online to insure receiving the materials in sufficient time. Materials are mailed priority mail.

STEPS FOR COMPLETING THE OFFICIALS' REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Step 1: Pay registration by mailing registration form printed from the NSAA website, or register online paying with credit card.
- Step 2: Receive packet containing open book test and rulebook(s) in the mail. This information will be sent during the months indicated in the above table.
- Step 3: Attend or view NSAA rules meeting. The rules meeting schedule is listed for all activities on NSAA web site.
- Step 4: The open book test must be completed by the test deadline. It must be completed online using your secure pass code. (You will receive instructions for online test taking in your packet).
- Step 5: After you take the test online you can view your corrected test three days following the due date. (If you are a 1st year official in any sport you will also receive the NSAA officials' patch for your officiating uniform.) All officials can purchase additional patches for \$2 each.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETION OF NSAA OFFICIALS' APPLICATION FORM

** Please complete ALL spaces on the application form. Please print and mark in the spaces provided so that it is legible.

1. **Full Name:** Place your correct full name (First, Middle Initial, Last) on the application form.
2. **Social Security Number:** We will use your social security number as your official NSAA ID number. We must have your social security number to complete your registration. Your Social Security Number will not be released from the NSAA office. All documents containing social security numbers are shredded.
3. **Permanent Mailing Address:** This should be the address of your legal residence, and should be used consistently on all correspondence with the NSAA. All materials and correspondence will be sent to this address. **In case of a change of address, please update your address on line immediately.**
4. **Phone:** List the telephone number of your home, business, and cell phone including area code.
5. **E-Mail Address:** If you have a current e-mail address and check it regularly, please provide it. The NSAA will use your e-mail address as a means of communication with you. Also, it will be listed in the NSAA Officials' Roster for each sport that is

available on line for Athletic Directors of each member school in the state.

6. **Application Fees:** Check the sport or sports in which you wish to officiate. (If you plan to officiate in more than one sport, please complete an application and pay the proper fee for all sports at the same time.) The fee in 2006-2007 is \$35.00 per sport for all but football and basketball, which are \$40.00 each. *No refunds of registration fees will be made if an individual fails to complete registration.*
7. **Varsity Contests Worked:** It is required that you indicate in the space provided the number of varsity contests you worked last year for the following sports: football, volleyball, softball, basketball, wrestling, soccer, and baseball. (If none put zero.)
8. **First Year NSAA Official:** Please check this box if you are a first year official with the NSAA.
9. **Years as NSAA Official:** Please indicate the number of years that you have been registered with the NSAA as an active official. If you have not stayed registered in consecutive years please indicate the last year that you were registered.
10. **Total Amount Enclosed:** List the total amount of money that is enclosed with your NSAA officials' application form.
11. **Sign and Date the Application Form** to verify you have read the NSAA regulations governing officials and understand that officials are considered independent contractors and not employees of the NSAA.

OFFICIATING RULES MATERIALS

Officiating rules materials will be sent to individuals who complete application (including payment of the proper fee). Normally, football, volleyball, and softball materials will be mailed in **July/August**; basketball, wrestling, and swimming/diving in **October/November**; soccer, baseball, and track and field materials will be mailed in **January/February**. These materials generally include the open book test, NFHS official rules publications, and other information pertinent to the individual sport.

2009-2010 NSAA RULES MEETINGS

The sites and dates of the 2009-2010 NSAA sponsored rules interpretation meetings are posted on the NSAA website. **Please note that the NSAA is also offering the rules meeting online.** A meeting will last between one and two hours and will include rules interpretations and mechanics and techniques of officiating. **Any official who does not attend or view one of the NSAA rules interpretation meetings in the sport he/she wishes to officiate will not be eligible to officiate varsity contests.**

NSAA TESTS FOR OFFICIALS

Note: Tests must be completed on line by midnight on the due date. Upon receipt of the completed open book examination with a score of at least **80% for registered, 85% for approved, and 90% for certified** classification, plus verification of attendance at an NSAA rules meeting, the official will become eligible to work varsity contests. Registration is not complete and an official is not eligible to officiate unless the open book test, with a passing score, is submitted at the proper time.

Supervised Test

Opportunities will be given to all officials to take the supervised test in football, volleyball, softball, basketball, wrestling, soccer, and baseball. Officials are encouraged to improve their knowledge of the rules by taking the test. Officials lacking a sufficient number of years of previous experience to move up in classification at the present time may take the supervised test now, and grades received will remain on record to be used when higher classification is possible. **A list of scheduled locations and dates for 2009-2010 is posted on the NSAA website.** The tests are offered on two separate dates. Only one score will be recorded per year. If someone should take the test on both dates, only the first score will be recorded.

Officials in the **Registered** classification are required to take the supervised test at least once every **five years** and score **65%** or better. If you were registered as an official in 2004, you must have taken the supervised test in your sport either in 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, or 2009 and score **65%** or better so you have a passing supervised test score on your record prior to August 2010. If not, registration in 2010 will not be accepted.

Officials who hold the classification of **Approved** are required to take the supervised test at least once every **five years** and score **75%** or better, and **Certified** officials are required to take the supervised test at least once every **three years** and score **80%** or better.

NSAA REGULATIONS GOVERNING OFFICIALS

In order to complete registration requirements, all officials must agree to abide by the following NSAA regulations:

1. Submit proper application fees and a complete NSAA officials' application form.
2. Attend or view a 2009-2010 NSAA-sponsored rules meeting held in the sport the official desires to officiate.

3. Submit the online open book test by proper date and receive a passing score on the open book test.
4. Only NSAA registered officials shall officiate varsity high school contests.
5. If any official fails to complete registration with the NSAA for 2009-2010 and does not notify schools with which he/she has contracts, the official will not be allowed to register the following year.
6. Contracts.
 - a. Contracts shall be signed by all officials.
 - b. Substitutions shall not be made unless consent is received from competing schools.
 - c. In case of a broken contract, the amount of the fee, excluding mileage, shall be paid by the offending party to the offended party, except when a contract is broken because of reasons beyond the control of either party or by mutual consent.
 - d. If an official has been convicted of any crime involving moral turpitude or has committed any act that subjects the NSAA or its member schools to public embarrassment or ridicule, the contract is null and void.
7. Comply with the NSAA regulations and Code of Ethics as presented in the 2008-2009 NSAA Officials' Manual.

AFFILIATE REGISTRATION IN OTHER STATES

Reciprocity Agreement: Officials registered (and living) in Nebraska wishing to work in Iowa, Kansas, South Dakota, Missouri, Wyoming or Colorado are to write directly to that State Association office. The Colorado and Kansas registration fee is \$15.00 per sport; Wyoming, South Dakota, Iowa, and Missouri are \$10.00 per sport. These special rates are set because of the reciprocal agreement involving Nebraska.

Officials **living in** and **registered in** Kansas, Iowa, Missouri, South Dakota, Wyoming, and Colorado may register in Nebraska by paying a \$10.00 per sport registration fee to the NSAA office in Lincoln.

If an official's home state does not register officials in a participating sport, then an official must be registered in the state in which he/she is going to officiate.

Nebraska Residents: An official whose legal residence is in Nebraska **MUST** be registered with the NSAA in order to be eligible to officiate high school varsity games in Nebraska.

PUBLICATION OF 2009-2010 NSAA REGISTERED OFFICIALS

The names, addresses, and classifications of all officials registered in football, volleyball, and softball will be posted on line in **September**, officials registered in wrestling, swimming/diving, and basketball in **December**; officials registered in soccer, baseball, and track and field in **April**. These rosters will provide schools an up-to-date list of all officials and their classifications. Those individuals that have access to this listing are: officials, athletic directors, and some college athletic directors. The individual official can check his/her current classification on line using his/her pass code.
