

NSAA District III Meeting Minutes

Wednesday, November 9th, 2023 - Noon
Northeast Community College, Lifelong Learning Center, Norfolk, NE

The NSAA District III meeting was called to order by District Three Chairman Jeff Bellar at 12:04 p.m. Mr. Bellar introduced the district managing committee and reviewed the agenda.

Roll call was held with 50 member schools present and 5 absent. The voting representative for each school physically present at the meeting was given a clicker with the number assigned to each school.

Mel Waley provided public comment on sanctioning Lacrosse at the NSAA Level. Ms. Waley remarked on the positive aspects of Lacrosse, as well as the availability of coaches and officials within the state of Nebraska. Mr. Bellar thanked her for her time and her comments.

No comments were made in NSAA Member comment.

A motion was made by Battle Creek, second by Neligh-Oakdale to approve the minutes of the January 2023 meeting. Motion carried by voice vote.

A motion was made by Winside, second by Hartington Cedar Catholic, to approve the Financial Report. Motion carried by voice vote.

Dr. Jon Cerny, NSAA Board of Director Member from District III, gave his Director's Report. Dr. Cerny thanked the District III representatives for the opportunity to represent them on the board of directors. Dr. Cerny congratulated schools that won trophies this fall at the NSAA championship contests, and wished all the teams still in the playoffs good luck. He asked everyone to inform their constituents within their communities of the basketball changes in regards to fouls per quarter. Girls sports and gender participation were discussed, as well as the NSAA's sound financial situation, the great softball turnout at the state tournament. Dr. Cerny discussed the rollback year next year, and policy changes that may be occurring to the NSAA regarding the open meetings law and Robert's rules of order. Finally, Dr. Cerny discussed the potential for fining schools not meeting the may 1st deadline in terms of posting their students, and CPR requirements of coaches, ensuring that every school meets those requirements.

Jason Polk-Wisner Pilger, gave the class caucus committee report.

Kayla Fischer, representative from the Athletic directors' association, gave her report.

Greg Conn representative from the Nebraska Coaches Association, gave his report.
