A **three-fifths** majority vote for each proposal is necessary to pass. Following is the vote total required, depending on the number of delegates present:

In addition to requiring a positive **three-fifths** majority of the delegates present, the following proposals will also require a referendum vote of the NSAA membership:

- 1. Proposals changing the Constitution
- 2. Proposals changing eligibility bylaws
- 3. Any proposal amended at Representative Assembly
- 4. Any proposal brought from the floor at Representative Assembly

In order for a proposal to become a rule of the association, 35% (109 schools) or more of the total NSAA membership must vote in the referendum. A positive **three-fifths** majority of the referendum will make the proposal a rule of the Association.

Legislative Bodies

1. The NSAA is a membership organization which utilizes certain member-based legislative bodies to self-govern. Those include 6 Member Districts, a Legislative Commission, and a Representative Assembly (Legislative Bodies). The following rules apply to the Legislative Bodies but not other formal or informal committees, task forces, advisory bodies, or other groups that may advise or assist in conducting the business of the NSAA.

2. Legislative Bodies may meet in person or electronically as determined by the chair or lead of any meeting of the Legislative Body.

3. Notice of meetings of the Legislative Bodies will be published on the NSAA website a reasonable time prior to the meeting. The notice will include the date, time, and location of the meeting.

4. The chair or lead of meetings of the Legislative Bodies will prepare an agenda for each meeting or ensure an agenda is prepared, which will be posted on the NSAA website a reasonable time prior to each meeting.

5. Each Legislative Body will keep minutes of its meetings, which will be posted on the NSAA website a reasonable time after the minutes are finalized.

6. Members of the public are permitted to attend meetings of the Legislative Bodies, unless the meeting or any portion of the meeting is closed by the Legislative Body.

7. Each Legislative Body may designate its method for conducting business at its meeting consistent with all NSAA Constitution, Bylaw, or other duly-enacted provisions. In the absence of any rules enacted by the Legislative Body generally or as applicable to a specific meeting, Legislative Bodies will use the same rules as the NSAA Board for taking formal action and discussing agenda items.

Summary:

There have been several changes over the past few years to the organized practice rule with regard to the length of time, the ratio of coaches/athletes, allowing pitchers/catchers to start early, and the type of equipment that is allowed (SEE 3.2.3). The outcome appears to be that we are just trying to find loopholes year after year to get our coaches more time to work with our athletes.

As a result, I propose that we have two "dead periods" during the calendar year.

- 1. December Moratorium (already established)
- 2. Any 7 consecutive day period in the month of July.

The intent of the December Moratorium and the July Moratorium is to provide coaches, athletes, and other school personnel a five to seven-day break from the activity season. This rule is to be interpreted as a five to seven-day dead period without organized practices, structured conditioning sessions, or meetings of any type. It is the member school's responsibility to monitor and enforce this rule. School-owned facilities shall be closed to all grades 9-12 workout activities during the moratorium (team or athletic meetings, practice, competition, weight-training, conditioning, open gym, or other physical activities).

The rest of the calendar year is free to use as you wish. There will no longer be an established practice rule with the exception of the two dead periods.

Pros: Eliminate the potential for rules being broken and more proposals written to skirt the rules **Cons:** Don't see any at this time.

Rationale:	Rational: School districts require their own background checks and district wide requirements (vector trainings) NSAA requirementsexternal coaches will not be required to possess a certificate. School districts require much more than a first aid course and a coaching fundamental on-line class in order to be certified.
Pros:	External coaches do not have to do double trainings and other requirements by the state. Will not have to pay for another background check.

Cons: Coaches may coach without any certification.
