Inaugural NSAA Unified Sports, Bowling Championships to be Held in Lincoln

LINCOLN – The Nebraska School Activities Association (NSAA) is pleased to announce that the inaugural NSAA Unified Sports, Bowling Championships will be held in Lincoln on December 5th at Sun Valley Lanes.

"Providing championship opportunities for students with intellectual disabilities in conjunction with students without intellectual disabilities has been a long time goal of the NSAA," said NSAA Executive Director Dr. Jim Tenopir. "In combined efforts with Special Olympics Nebraska, we are thrilled that vision is becoming a reality culminating in the inaugural Unified Sports, Bowling Championships."

"Unified Sports has the power to completely transform a school community, and this event is the first of many in our state that will make a difference in providing a way for every student to feel like they matter," adds Special Olympics Nebraska President & CEO Carolyn Chamberlin.
