NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

(This information supplements the Local Rules and Conditions of Competition for NSAA Golf Events)

Teeing Ground:

The Gold Tee-Markers define the teeing ground for the Championship.

Abnormal Ground Conditions:

<u>Areas of Unusual Turf Damage Created by Animals</u> (i.e. raccoons, skunks and the like) may be considered *Ground Under Repair*, but only when so declared by a Rules Official. Rule 25-1.

Flower and Plant Beds are deemed to be ground under repair even though not so defined by white lines. Rule 25-1.

<u>Turf Nursery located right of hole #14</u> is a ground under repair from which play is prohibited. Such nursery is not defined, but it constitutes all of the area cut to putting green height or less. Rule 25-1.

Deciding Ties:

In the event of a tie for first place in either the individual or team competition, a hole-by-hole play-off using holes 13-14-18 will determine the champion. See the NSAA Golf Manual for play-off procedure.

Obstructions:

Immovable obstructions adjacent to each other are to be treated as a single obstruction.

Yardage Posts are deemed to be movable obstructions. Rule 24-1.

Staked Trees are deemed to be immovable obstructions. Rule 24-2.

Artificially Surfaced Roads and Paths include those surfaced with crushed brick, gravel or asphalt. Rule 24-2.

Out of Bounds:

<u>Out of Bounds</u> is defined by the perimeter fence and white lines in addition to white stakes. When defined by white lines, the line itself is out of bounds. When both white stakes and white lines exist, the stakes identify out of bounds and the lines define out of bounds.

Scoring Area:

Scoring Area – A scorecard is deemed to be returned when the player has left the scoring room.

Transportation:

Players must walk at all times during the stipulated round.
