The Frankfort High School Hot Dogs made news this past December when students raised over \$32,000. Frankfort High School is located in central Nebraska and has an enrollment of 1,300 students in grades 9-12.

All 329 seniors participated in the event and donated their time and grills for the project.

Hy-Vee graciously donated 10,000 hot dogs for the event and Inflatable Wonderland donated three bounce houses. Additionally, the Hot Dog Athletic Boosters raffled off a 2023 Ford F150, which was donated by Frankfort Ford.

Participation in the evening of festivities grew by leaps and bounds when senior Allie Smores posted a TikTok advertising the event. Her post went viral and had over seven million views and was shared over 800,000 times.

Attendance for the event was estimated at 6,500 total patrons.

The senior class plans to use the money raised to support the local Frankfort food pantry and also pay off outstanding lunch balances for all of Frankfort's 1,300 students.
