NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

(This information supplements the Local Rules and Terms of the Competition for 2024 NSAA Golf Championships & Events)

- 1. <u>Deciding Ties:</u> In the event of a tie for first place in the individual or team competition, a hole-by-hole play-off using holes 1 & 9 will determine the champion unless otherwise notified by the Committee. See the NSAA Golf Manual for play-off procedure.
- **2.** <u>Teeing Ground:</u> The State Championship Tee-Markers define the teeing area.
- 3. <u>Circle 10 Scoring</u>: Once a participant reaches 11 strokes or more, the participant has the option to pick up their ball, wait for the others to finish the hole and then move on to the next hole to continue play. The player who "picks up" their ball will be able to continue their round but is disqualified from the individual competition and their score is ineligible for that round's team score.
- 4. Scoring Area: A player's scorecard is deemed to be returned when the player has left the scoring room.

5. Out of Bounds:

- a. Out of Bounds is defined by white lines and white paint dots in addition to white stakes, white posts and fence posts. When defined by white lines, the line itself is out of bounds.
- b. The Parking Lot and Entrance Road are out of bounds
- c. **Hole 11 & Hole 14** Out of Bounds is defined by the curbing of the street behind the putting green. A ball is out of bounds if it lies beyond the curbing even though it might be on another part of the golf course.
- d. The Driving Range is out of bounds during the play of No. 18, defined by white posts.
- e. The white posts inside the penalty area between holes No. 12 and 14 DO NOT define out of bounds for either hole.

6. Ground Under Repair includes, but is not limited to:

- a. Decorative Flower and Plant Beds. When enclosed by cart paths or adjacent to immovable obstructions they are treated as a single abnormal course condition.
- b. The Tree Nursery Area between holes 16, 17 & 18, defined by white posts labeled "GUR".

7. Movable Obstructions include, but are not limited to:

a. Yardage posts. If the post, or any part of it, is not easily movable, it is an immovable obstruction.

8. <u>Immovable Obstructions</u> include, but are not limited to:

- a. Staked Trees.
- b. Artificially Surfaced Roads and Paths including those surfaced with crushed brick, gravel or asphalt.
- c. **Arboretum Plagues** Relief available from the plague only.
- d. Holes 10, 15 and 16 The Maintenance Road adjacent to the canal.
- e. Immovable Obstructions Adjacent to Each Other are to be treated as a single immovable obstruction.

9. Loose Impediments:

a. Mulch used as decoration for tree bases.

10. Temporary Immovable Obstructions:

Relief on Either Side: Model Local Rule F-23 is in effect and includes any temporary immovable obstruction installed for the championship. If a player has either physical interference or line of sight interference from any TIO and is entitled to relief, as an additional option, she may take relief on the other side of the TIO along the arc without penalty. When taking relief on the other side of the TIO, the player may only take relief under the TIO Local Rule, not Rule 16.1.

11. <u>Final Decisions on Any Disputed Points</u> will be made by Jeff Stauss, NSAA; Craig Ames, NebGolf and Robert Thomason, Monument Shadows GC.
