TYPE OF ARGUMENT

Choose one:

A-Condemnation -- a topic or issue that the student believes should be stopped

B-Exploration -- a topic or issue the student believes is misunderstood or deserves another look

GOOD ARGUMENTS...

Are

Specific and Inclusive -- can be proven and made to appeal to most listeners

Thought Provoking -- challenges the audience to think critically

Literary -- able to pull multi-genre material that is logical, emotional, moral

Are Not

Based on a 'yes, and...' premise -- easy to agree without changing attitude

Heartless, but competitive -- great material but lacks personal motivation

No Solution available -- nothing the audience can ultimately do about the issue

Why does this topic matter to you?

What should it matter to the audience?

What don't people already know about this?

Why is now the time to advocate this idea?

What is/are the broader societal issue(s) at play?

Why are you the best person to talk about this?

What will your call to action be?
